Covid Routines

I thought I would update you on the most recent Covid procedures/routines in school

Thank you for your support with the re-introduction of wearing of masks in school. We are appreciative in everyone for having a positive attempt at remembering to wear them in order to try to reduce transmission and support everyone in our community.

We continue to stock gel in dispensers and tissues in every classroom to support positive hand hygiene.

We have fixed DfE CO2 monitors in the rooms identified and monitor the levels of CO2 within those rooms (mostly smaller rooms, offices or where we may need to monitor ventilation). Other rooms are well ventilated via the windows and doors.

Although we can still host large group assemblies, we have kept them online for now, especially in the run up to Christmas.

We continue to encourage twice-weekly lateral flow testing for all staff and students. If your child needs more LFTs then they can collect them from Mr Cropper, otherwise they are distributed during form time.

We continue to follow and review government guidance as we receive updates. We will review the procedures and hopefully as infection rates reduce, we will be able to plan for our large audience/group special events again soon.

Covid Testing on return in January

As you are aware, schools have been asked to carry out onsite testing again in January upon our return from the Christmas break. This will be for all year groups at Baines, and will be one test only. Mr Cropper has been working very hard to organise our testing so that we can maximise numbers and minimise the loss of time in lessons. Thank you again to our volunteers who are helping, we really would struggle without such a fantastic team of parents/carers and volunteers.

The testing schedule will be as follows:

Tuesday 4th January

No pupils physically in school for lessons on this day

Years 11, 7 and 8Y will come in for testing, and then return home when completed. Self study work to be provided for that day.

Years 10, 9 and 8X to have live online lessons following their normal timetable for that day.

Wednesday 5th January

Years 11, 7 and 8Y in school for normal timetabled lessons

Years 10, 9 and 8X will come in for testing, and then return home when completed. Self study work to be provided for that day.

Thursday 6th January

All pupils in school, following timetable as normal.

The exact timings for each day, indicating when pupils should be attending for testing, will be published via ClassCharts and a parental email later this week. Please do not worry if you do not know if your child is 8Y or 8X, the information that goes out will make it clear. Please remind your children to ensure they know how to access Class Charts and Google Classroom before we finish for Christmas.

May I take this opportunity to thank you for your support throughout the testing programme. We are expecting over 80% of our school population to test with us on our return, which is an absolutely fantastic number and shows that as a school community, we are all prioritising the safety and wellbeing of those around us.

If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to contact Mr Cropper at school.

I know it continues to be a challenge through the pandemic, but human nature can be such a wonderful thing. I want to thank all the staff, students and families for your hard work and support over this term. A special thank you for supporting the charities and special events we have had to support those less fortunate. Please everyone take care over the festive season, give warmth, happiness and kindness. Enjoy special moments with your families and friends and most of all, stay safe and be happy!

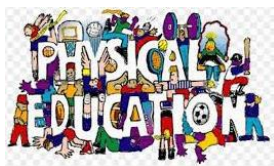

The girls have been enjoying a fun, full body workout to a "banging" soundtrack. The routines combine dance, toning and combat moves with options to suit all fitness levels.



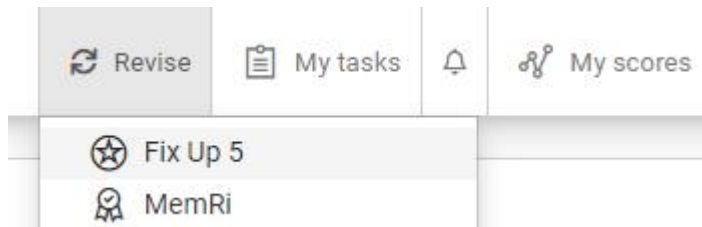

Read Around RE

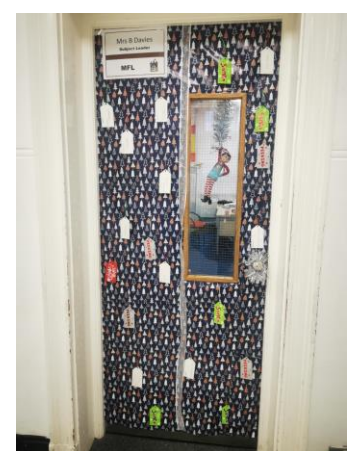

Year 11 Update from Mr Mycock

Year 11 have had a busy term and now we start to think about the new year as our preparations for the final exams continue in earnest!

We are in the process of organising the Mock Exam Timetable and will communicate this as soon as it is ready and hopefully in the first week of the new year. This set of exams, beginning on **Monday 31st January 2022**, will be conducted in the Sports Hall and will be invigilated by the same staff who will oversee the final exams in the summer. These exams will test everything that students have studied since the start of Year 10, will mirror as close to the full GCSE process as possible and are the final chance for teachers to see how students perform in real situations. The outcomes of these exams will be given to students on their "Mock Result Day" when they will receive their grades in brown envelopes, as they will in the summer, and they will inform the teaching that will take place subsequently.

I have also finalised the arrangements for Elevate Education to deliver two sessions to students to support preparation for exams and stimulate revision. On **Thursday 6th January 2022** we will receive the "**Path of the Study Sensei**" training session. This seminar looks at how to break down study in to manageable chunks throughout the rest of the year and shares the best techniques used by the most successful students.

The second session, "**Ace your Exams**" will be delivered after the Mock Exams on **Thursday 17th March 2022**. This session supports students in reviewing their past performance and unpicks critical exam skills, stress management and the importance of planning.

At **5pm on Thursday 17th March 2022**. there will also be a **Year 11 Parent/Carer Briefing** led by Elevate to share the materials and techniques used and to inform parents/carers about what to expect

during the exam season. I will confirm closer to the time whether this event will be a remote event or face-to-face in school.

Year 11 Progress Afternoon is also on **Thursday 17th March 2022** when all students are expected to remain on site until 4pm and meet with each of their subject teachers to discuss the final push for the exams in each subject area. It may be possible by then for Parents and Carers to also be invited to attend this event with their child so that they are also well informed (this will be confirmed closer to the date).

Excellence Programme

This term has seen the launch of our new Excellence Programme at Baines School. In order to provide our able, gifted and/or talented students with a stimulating and enriching curriculum beyond the classroom, a programme of Excellence Experiences is in development that will challenge students to experience subject areas and future career pathways away from their comfort zones. We have recently launched our pilot programme with Y10 (we have identified 62 students to take part in this programme) and we will look to identify more students from Y7/8/9 in the New Year. Our Y10 cohort have their first Excellence Experience in January 2022 with a guest talk led by Roz Bird (Commercial Director for Silverstone Park), with a theatre trip to Manchester then booked for February. Meet the Professionals – Virtual Masterclasses for Year 10 & 11

Over the last two weeks we have welcomed another two professional guests and offered a **Maritime and Law Masterclass**.

Students who attended the Maritime Masterclass learnt all about working at sea and heard from Dave who has worked in the Maritime industry for 19 years. Our professional guest provided insight into a range of topics including:

- The range of progression routes leading to becoming a Captain or Chief Engineer (which are the top two job positions in the Maritime industry).
- The skills required to succeed on a ship e.g problem solving and the ability to multi task and prioritise workload.

Students who attended the Law Masterclass were provided an insight into a wide range of legal professions including the role of a solicitor, lawyer, barrister and law researcher. Our professional guest provided insight into a range of topics including:

- The two main types of law e.g Criminal and Civil Law.
- The skills required to be successful within the industry e.g debating skills.
- Where to start reading and learning about Law e.g In Black and White (book) and Law in Action (podcast).

The final Masterclass of 2021 will be for **Photography** and this will take place on **Wednesday 15th December** during lunch. Just a reminder to all parents and carers that we participate in Operation Encompass. This is a unique Police and Education early intervention safeguarding partnership which ensures that a child/ young person's school/ college is informed, prior to the start of the next school day, that there has been an incident of Domestic Abuse or any incident to which the child/ young person has been exposed in which they are considered to be vulnerable to harm, and which might then have an impact on them in school/ college the following day.

Each school/ college is informed of all such incidents, not just those where an offence can be identified or those which are graded as high risk. The partnership recognises that all incidents of Domestic Abuse/ vulnerability can be harmful to children and young people.

This information will be shared throughout the year, including holidays and weekends. Information will only be shared with the school/ college by the police where it is identified that a young person was present, witnessed or was involved in a domestic abuse incident. Our key adults are Mrs Doherty and Mrs Harkins, who will keep this information confidential, and will only share it on a need to know basis, for instance, to teaching staff for the child or young person. It will not be shared with other school students.
