



### Headteacher Update – 14<sup>th</sup> March 2022

Dear Parents, Carers, Students, Family and Friends of Baines School,

We are now halfway through this half term, and it is very busy as usual. Some of the events that happened in the last two weeks will feature in the next update. Some examples have been: one hundred and eleven year 7 students going to North Wales on camp and the students who remained in school completed excellent project work, developing their teamworking skills; we had a group who attended the International Women's event at Blackpool Sixth Form and a mixed group went to see Tim Peake at the theatre. Year 9 should have handed their options forms in by now (we do have a few students who have missed the deadline and need to get their forms in urgently). Year 11 had their photographs and mock results day on Friday. If they did not show you their grades, please ask to see it! Please see the update for further information about supporting year 11 in the next few weeks.

We have been getting a lot of queries about special educational needs recently, this has increased as the health services back log has lengthened. We are finding it hard to respond as quickly as parents/carers would like, because our staff are teaching or working with children during the school day. ### Massive increase to fuel and food prices

As everyone will be aware, the cost of gas and electricity has increased such a lot recently. This is really hitting our school, because our new contract puts the cost at more than £55K more for one-year supply than the previous contract. We will be encouraging staff and children to turn off computer and lights when not in use to help. If you can reinforce, this approach may also help at home.

On a similar theme, we are no longer able to sustain the same prices for food because of the increase in costs. I am always reluctant to increase costs to children because it is vital that they have access to delicious nutritious food during the day. From Monday 21<sup>st</sup> March we will be increasing the cost of all drinks and snacks by 5p and all main meals by 10p. The FSM students will still be able to access the Meal Deal within their daily amount. Mr Noon works really hard to source high quality ingredients at competitive prices, we are still cheaper than many schools and I hope you will be supportive in encouraging your child to use our refectory. We are open from 8am for breakfast, at break for snacks a and at lunchtime for meals.

Mr Noon and his team have been trialling new foods to try to encourage our students to eat healthily and to broaden their choices. In order to be fully compliant with the school food standards, we have reduced the number of days that the traditional sausage rolls are on sale, but have created the 'sausage roll/wrap' instead. Last week we had the most delicious filled potatoes with salad and this week we are trialling the 'Roast Beef Dinner Wrap'.

Please continue to encourage your child to work hard, to the best of their ability and to attend enrichment activities so they get the very most from their time at Baines School.

### Year 11 Update – Mr Mycock

Year 11 have had a very busy few weeks and their preparations for their final exams are in full swing! Last week they collected their mock exam results and are now in the process of celebrating their successes and addressing their gaps in knowledge and understanding.

### Year 11 "Ace your Exams" Day and Parent/Carer Seminar – Thursday 17th March 2022

This day supports all of our students in reflecting on their performance in the mock exams and gives some further guidance in how to improve their preparation for the exams in the summer. Each 1-hour session will be led by "Elevate", an organisation who specialise in supporting young people in preparing effectively for exams and motivating learners to act on guidance given. At 5.30pm on 17th March, we invite all Year 11 Parents and Carers to school for a face-to-face seminar in the school hall led by Elevate to explore the themes and techniques used with the young people earlier in the day, followed by a short session led by Mr Mycock. This session will share top tips for supporting your child through the exam season and surviving it as a family! We look forward to seeing as many parents and carers there as possible at this invaluable event.

### Supporting Progress

A previously advertised event of Progress Afternoon has had to be adjusted as we feel that we can no longer send some students home to facilitate the event given the lost learning during the pandemic. However, having looked at our previous approach, now is a good time to change and we believe that we can have a greater impact in different ways.

Each subject area will be responding to the needs of their learners in different ways in the classroom, through tailored homework, use of GCSEPod and Seneca Learning, after-school or before-school intervention sessions and, most importantly through the mocks informing our teaching going forwards. Parents/carers may receive phone calls from some teachers to reinforce what is needed for their specific subject, but this will be on a needs-led basis.

The Year 11 Reports are in the process of being finalised, checked and quality assured. These documents also give some key advice for our young people moving forward over the coming weeks.

As you will be aware the date of the Year 11 Prom is Monday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2022. Details of how to pay for the Prom, Hoodies and Year Books are all on ParentPay and students have been provided with a link to a Google Form to help design their Hoody.


### **Creative Arts – Mr Shillitoe**


We are currently looking for professionals who work in the following areas:
