As part of this awareness and Baines School approach to anti-bullying, I want to communicate and reinforce what is understood by the term bullying and what we as a school will challenge:

Bullying can occur as a result of several types of anti-social behaviour.

Bullying is:

- **<u>Deliberately</u>** hurtful (including aggression)
- Repeated over a period of time
- Difficult for victims to defend themselves against

Bullying is behaviour which can be defined as a <u>repeated and targeted</u> attack (physical, psychological, social or verbal).

It is **not bullying** when:

- There is no intention to hurt or harm i.e., behaviour is thoughtless or accidental
- There is a one-off fight/argument between pupils of equal stature or strength
- There is a good reason why others cannot be included in a group activity
- A pupil is called a nickname with which they are happy
- Friends have a temporary fall out
